

Workshop: Is Email Killing Collaboration?

Email is great for connecting two people. But when it's used to connect three, four or more, it quickly gets difficult. To avoid that difficulty, people avoid collaboration. This happens most days in most organisations. And yet there is no conversation about the extent or impact of this problem, and how to solve it.

This workshop opens that conversation, by addressing three questions:

- How widely and in what ways is email actually used?
- What is the impact of the use of email on collaboration?
- How can people collaborate online more easily?

Using a research instrument developed by Dan participants will be working together to identify and quantify the problems associated with the use of email, then identify ways to address those issues. The output from this process will be made available to participants at the end of the workshop, so that they can be used to solve real world problems.

A current New Zealand Passport that was issued after 1 January 2004

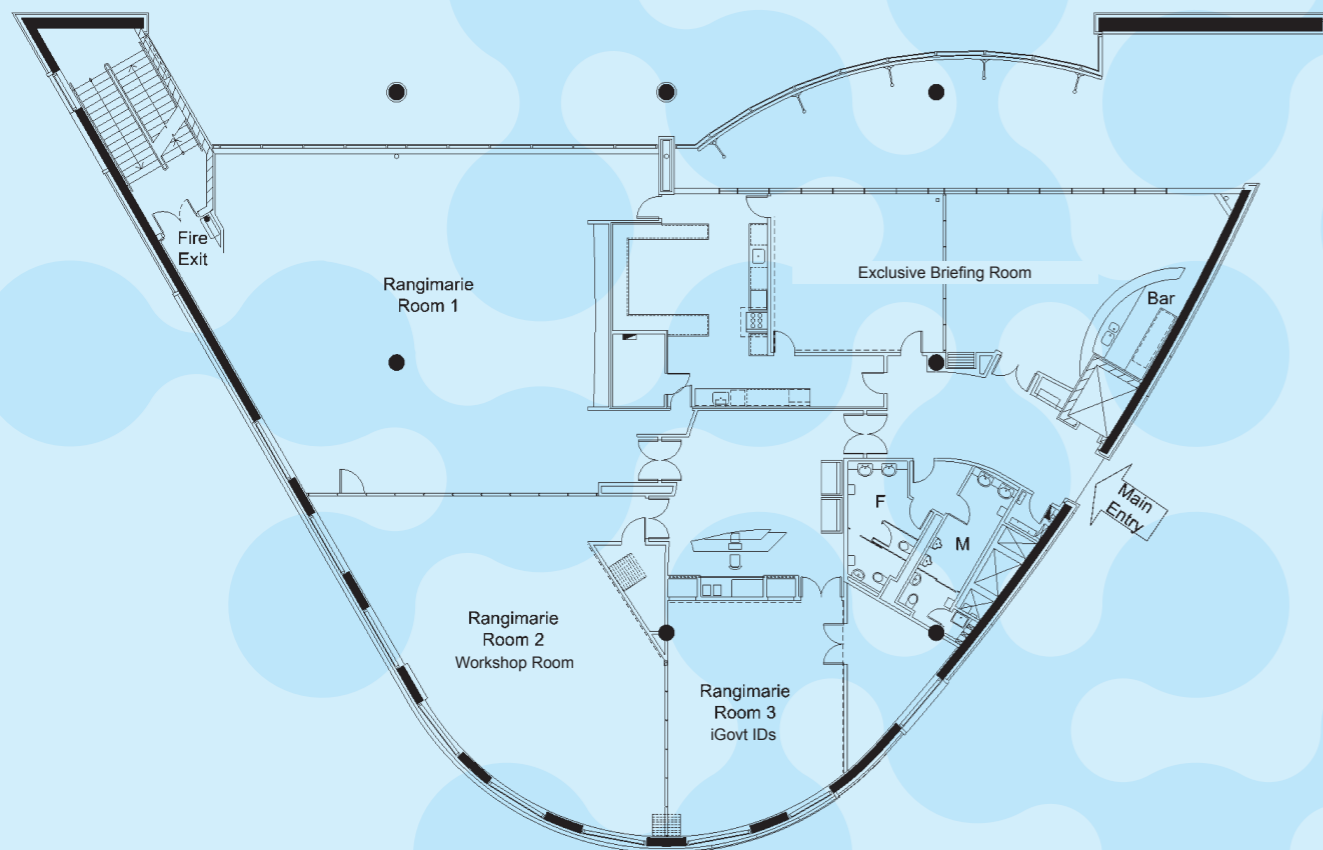
